The General Conference of the International Labour Organization adopted the Convention on June 14, 2007



The objective is to ensure decent conditions of work on board fishing vessels with regard to:



 minimum requirements for work on board (Part III, artt. 9 – 12: minimum age, medical examination)






(Part IV, artt. 13-24: manning and hours of rest, crew list, fisher's work agreement, repatriation, recruitment and placement, payment of fishers)

\circledast accommodation and food

(Part V, artt. 25 - 28)





occupational safety and health protection, social security

(Part VI, artt. 29 - 39: medical care, occupational safety and healt care, accident prevention, social security, protection in the case of work-related sickness, injury or death)

Date of entry into force: 16 Nov 2017
