



GFCM WORKING GROUP ON ILLEGAL UNREPORTED UNREGULATED FISHERY AND ON VMS 19-20 May 2021



Working Group on Illegal, Unreported and Unregulated fishing (WGIUU), 19 May

- The meeting carefully reviewed progress made during the two-year intersessional period in the implementation of GFCM decisions



- → The commitment of contracting parties and cooperating noncontracting parties (CPCs) was praised, despite the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic on the work of national administrations
 - The compliance tables for the year 2021 were adopted See Appendix 4
 - The meeting also encouraged that further progress be urgently made in the development and implementation of catch documentation schemes.

Working Group on VMS and related control systems (WGVMS), 20 May

- The need to urgently ensure the full implementation by all CPCs of national vessel monitoring system (VMS) was emphasized in order to promptly operationalize the establishment of a centralized/regional VMS and related control systems by the GFCM.
- The WGVMS also addressed the **monitoring of fisheries restricted areas** by CPCs noting the importance of furthering concerted efforts at the regional and subregional levels.

GFCM COMPLIANCE COMMITTEE 21 May 2021



Compliance Committee, 21 May

- Concerning the status of compliance with GFCM decisions, the Committee decided to upgrade the compliance categories of some contracting parties and cooperating non-contracting parties (CPCs).



More specifically, the **European Union, Morocco and Turkey** were upgraded to a **fully compliant status**, whereas Israel was upgraded to a partially compliant status.



- It also decided that the identification and clarification process would continue on the basis of a **compliance assessment scheme** which would streamline the detection of infringements and their severity.
- Several **proposals on compliance advice** to the Commission were presented and discussed:
 - GFCM flag State performance assessment framework, based on FAO Guidelines
 - extending the obligation to obtain an IMO number to all fishing vessels of 15m length overall (LOA) and above
 - the operationalization of the upcoming centralized/regional GFCM VMS and control systems,
 - the implementation of the electronic reporting system (ERS) (e-logbook) with a view to undertaking pilot projects
 - the introduction of a sighting procedure to facilitate the pursuit of fishing vessels caught in IUU fishing activities;
 - the **management of lost, abandoned and discarded fishing gear**, in line with FAO and RFMOs standards and guidelines;
 - the launching of a pilot project on a control and inspection scheme for the **common dolphinfish fishery**; and
 - the introduction of minima standards to improve the **control and monitoring of fisheries restricted areas (FRAs)**
